


MENTORSHIP & THE ARTS

Mentorship and the Arts program provided ten high-achieving students with opportunities to network with professionals in their field of study, preparing students for life after college. Students were asked to meet with their mentors at least five times during the academic year, during which they could conduct mock interviews, resume review sessions, and set goals together to accomplish during the year. This opportunity provided students with an insight into the first Freedom Forum Fundamental "Freedom of choice in labor" where students could explore a desired field with the guidance of a working professional. Furthermore, the Freedom Forum emphasized relationship development through art focused events where mentors and mentees engaged in extensive discourse over a meal and cultural performance.

In December of 2019, the Mentorship and the Arts program invited mentors and mentees to The Second City Annual Holiday Improv Brunch to share meals and laughter. In March of 2020, the mentors and mentees were set to meet again for dinner and a show at Broadway in Chicago. Unfortunately, due to the COVID-19 outbreak they were unable to meet in person. Since March, many of our mentees and mentors have made arrangements to meet virtually, continuing to grow their relationships past North Park University's academic year.


